From the ruins of a well-known documentary photography festival emerged a renewed artist-run Fotopub. The motive behind our newly established team is to thicken the focus of the festival onto contemporary photography, to promote Slovenian and international photographers of the younger generation and to build bridges between professionals and the public. Fotopub is therefore attempting to develop a necessary platform, intended for connecting young artists and professionals with their already established colleagues, thus evoking a constructive dialogue amongst them. In our efforts to expand the festival in the future, we started off in Novo mesto with the infrastructure built by the previous festival, but more importantly, we see its potential to become an international key player in the development of the emerging contemporary photography.

This year's programme of six exhibitions reaped the fruits of the first re-contextualised edition of the festival as it helped to define our role and ethos that we want to develop in the future years. The exhibition summarises the six shows we organised in August and is a fitting representative of the practices we pursue to feature. Subsequently, this exhibition in Maribor shows a qualitatively upgraded level of awareness of contemporary photographic practice – from differently reconfigured and utilised mediums to its considered and repeatedly conceptual presentations.

The spirit of a good art festival could be arguably seen in its upgrade, improvement and an eternal doubt, which stimulates the audience to witness and question a contemporary cultural fetishism. Whenever the content and the appearance of an object arises above a horizon of everyday usage, its use value changes into a catharsis of idolising the privileged. Repeatability of this sort of reversal is obviously common in the art world, although it needs a grip and a continuously perfect execution, to become a qualitative and, naturally, culturally and educationally instrumental factor of perception of contemporary art.

A known tradition in the Slovenian art scene, where fresh approaches and usage of distinctively different, and therefore qualitatively created and presented works, hardly find its place of presentation. It is important that the enthusiasm of young and the euphoria of older people unite and subsequently contribute to the progress and materialisation of the Slovenian contemporary creativity, which can unite with the spirit of international authors around the world.

Iza Pavlina (1991, SI) is an MA student of painting at the Academy of Fine Arts, Slovenia. She had her first major solo exhibition entitled Talk to Strangers! at the Erotic Gallery Račka (Celje) in 2014. She has also exhibited her work in group exhibitions at Media Nox Gallery (Maribor), Miklova Hiša Gallery (Ribnica), and Vžigalica Gallery.

Douglas Mandry (1989, CH) graduated at ECAL in 2013. Since then he has exhibited his work at Young Swiss Photography at Palexpo, ECAL Photography at Display Gallery and Galleria Carla Sozzani, Prix Voies—Off at Les Rencontres de la photographie, Arles, Jungkust at Fotomuseum Winterthur, Art Basel, and many more.
